5. Important dates and requirements

<u>Academic calendar:</u>	Fall semester Mid-August – late December Exams from late November to mid-December Spring semester: Early January – early June Exams from early May to early June Note: Dates to be announced 2-3 months ahead of semester start
Orientation days for international students	Fall: Mid-August (Aalesund campus), see web pages for other campuses. Spring: Early January (normally alongside and adjusted to regular lectures)
Deadlines for applications:	a) for Fall semester and whole academic year: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• EU/EEA students for regular courses or projects: May 1st• EU/EEA students for placements or combination placements/courses: April 1st• Non-EU/EEA students: April 1st b) for Spring semester: October 1st
Nomination:	Exchange students should be nominated by their home university before submitting their applications.
Language requirements:	English proficiency at level B2 is required. Students who wish to attend courses taught in Norwegian must have a very good command of the Norwegian language; alternatively have Danish or Swedish as mother tongue.
Norwegian language course:	NTNU Aalesund offers short courses in Norwegian language for Foreigners (7.5 ECTS credits) each semester. Separate application, deadline June 1 st for fall semester, November 1 st for spring semester.
Insurances:	Students are responsible to have their own health insurance. European students are required to bring a valid European Health Insurance Card. For more information, see www.ntnu.edu
Arrival and key delivery:	Students should arrive prior to the start of the introduction days. Key deliveries outside the housing office's (Sit) opening hours must be agreed in advance.

6. Accommodation Information

Student housing is run by the student welfare organisation Sit. In Aalesund, most exchange students stay at Sørnesvågen studentboliger, which is located in the campus area, only a 5 minutes' walk from the campus main buildings. Monthly rent starts from approx. NOK 3850, -. Prices are adjusted annually.

Note: Exchange students need a special code from NTNU before applying for housing, to be received normally with the admission letter.

7. Student Visa or Student Residence Permit

Non EU/EEA citizens must have a visa granted prior to coming to Norway.

All EU/EEA citizens staying over 3 months must register with the Norwegian immigration authorities. Special regulations apply for citizens from the Nordic countries.
